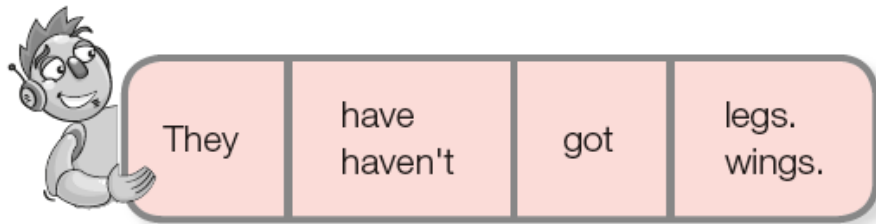

There are over 12,000 types of ants in the world. Ants are **insects** that live in groups called colonies. Each ant in the colony has a job to do. The queen ant is the largest ant in the colony and her job is to lay eggs. The male ants help the queen make new eggs. The female ants are the workers who protect the colony, gather food, and take care of the nest and the baby ants.

Ants have six legs and three body parts and are covered by an **exoskeleton**. The three body parts are the head, the thorax, and the abdomen. An ant's head has two eyes, two antennae and **mandibles**. Mandibles are useful tools to help the ant with carrying, building, fighting, and chewing.
